- We also appreciate the strong focus in the CPD on addressing protection issues, particularly in the North Caribbean Coast Autonomous Region (RACCN). Could UNICEF please elaborate on the "Schools of Values" strategy noted in paragraph 41 and explain how this will support efforts to address child protection issues?
- The "School of Values" is a strategy for the prevention of violence against children and adolescents. Families are accompanied through weekly group sessions for 4 months on 16 topics related to the protective role of mothers, fathers, and caregivers. The strategy addresses the challenges adolescents face in situations of violence, whether among peers, at home, or in other socialization spaces, and promotes violence-free environments.

 Annually, about 10,000 families participate in the School of Values strategy. In 2023, the Sports for Development (Football for Peace) will be included in the strategy for violence prevention tool.
