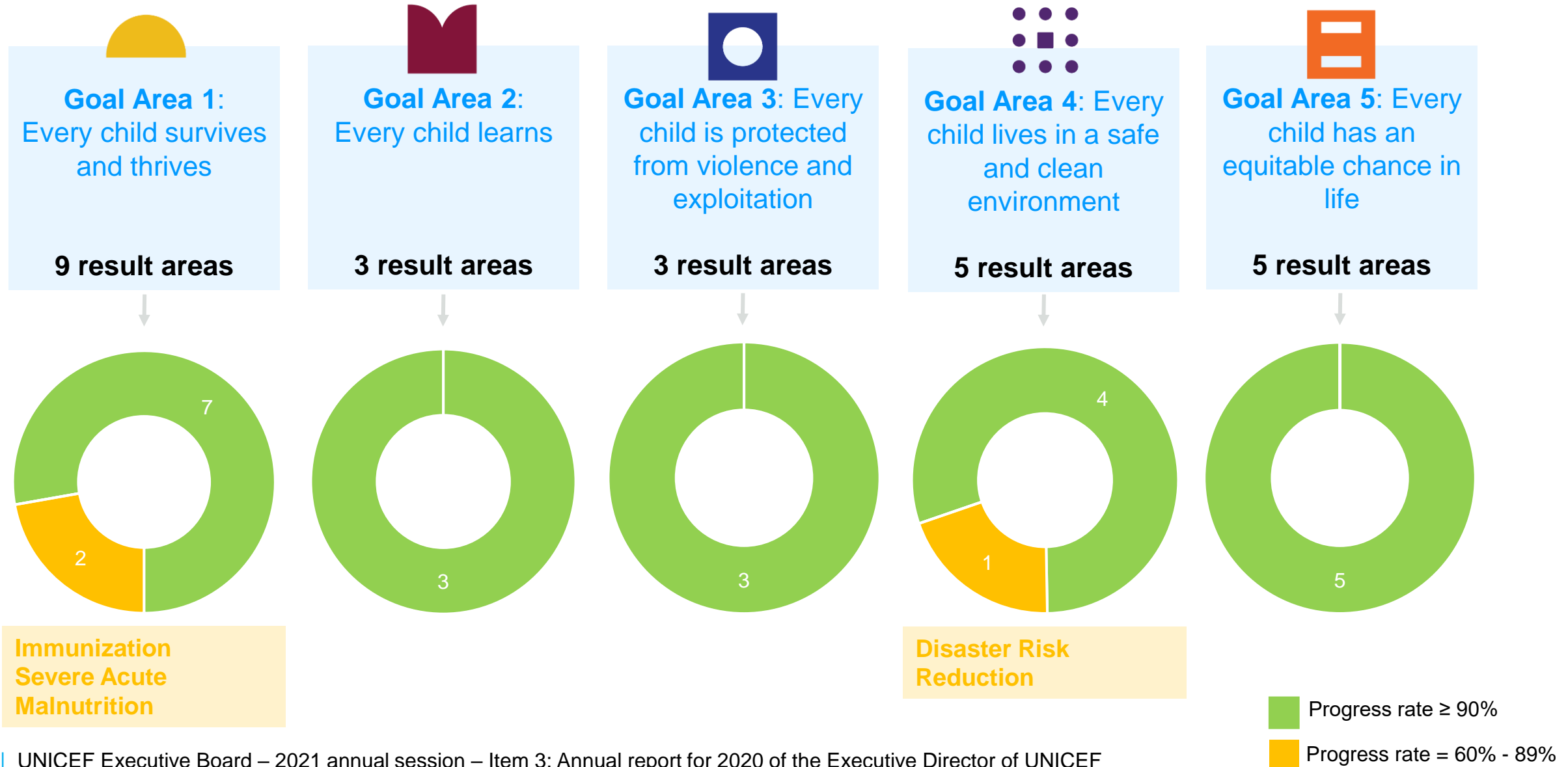

UNICEF performance in 2020



Results for children in times of COVID-19



More than 7.7 million children have participated in skills development programmes



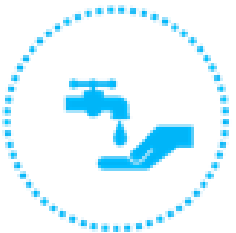
47.2 million children and caregivers accessed mental health and psychosocial support



5 million children with severe acute malnutrition were admitted for treatment globally



Over 130 million children were reached by cash transfer programmes



106 million people (including 58 million children) reached with critical WASH services and supplies



5 million adolescents participated in civic engagement in humanitarian settings

Cross-cutting results

Humanitarian Action



Responded to **455** humanitarian situations in **152 countries**



17 million children vaccinated against measles



39.1 million people accessed safe water for drinking, cooking and personal hygiene

Gender Equality



88% of the criteria met in the UN-SWAP



88 countries integrated gender considerations in social protection programming



Almost 1.2 million girls and women in humanitarian settings received menstrual health and hygiene services

REVENUE, EXPENSES AND RESOURCE MOBILIZATION

Goal Area	Total expense (millions)
Every child survives and thrives	\$2,181
Every child learns	\$1,167
Every child is protected from violence and exploitation	\$712
Every child lives in a safe and clean environment	\$1,122
Every child has an equitable chance in life	\$533

Direct programme assistance by Goal Area, 2020

Total revenue increased by 18% in 2020, to \$7,548 million

Regular resource revenue from the public sector decreased by 14%, to \$412 million (5% of total revenue)

Total humanitarian expense was at \$3,244 million

57% of the total 2020 expense

Public sector revenue = \$5,696 million

Private sector revenue = \$1,610 million

Stronger focus on outcomes, with a long-term vision addressing multidimensional causes of deprivation.



Prioritized interventions to **strengthen national systems** and technical capacities.



Coordinated action and engagement across sectors and partners.



Increased emphasis on resilience and **humanitarian-development-peace nexus**, in line with national priorities.
