	- Three out of the five targeted outcomes in the new CPD are in alignment with ADC's main (e.g. good governance and rule of law) and cross cutting priorities (e.g. gender equality, social inclusion). Those are <b>Outcome 2</b> (School-aged and adolescent	

boys and girls learn, acquire skills for life, demand, access and utilize services in a healthy, resilient and gender-responsive environment); Outcome 3 (The most vulnerable children are protected from poverty and violence, are accessing justice and social and child protection services, and are thriving in a caring family environment) and Outcome 4 (There is a more conducive environment for policy and child rights governance, with a focus on equity accountability and on social and gender norms change).

- Outcome 2 (School-aged and adolescent boys and girls learn, acquire skills for life, demand, access and utilize services in a healthy, resilient and gender-responsive environment) is very relevant and timely for Albania considering the high youth migration rates.
- Under Outcome 3 UNICEF supported the Ministry of Justice to develop and budget for the National Justice for Children Strategy a first of its kind document dedicated to child-friendly justice in Albania. In the new CPD UNICEF will also focus on ensuring the rights of children are respected when confronted with the justice system. ADC has an ongoing project with UNDP in Albania that aims to increase access to justice for vulnerable groups and strengthen the free legal aid system. To that regard, 8 free legal aid centres are operating in Albania and supported by ADA. We would encourage UNICEF to join forces and seek synergies with ADA and UNDP to ensure free legal assistance is provided for children/youth.
