Comments on specific	We commend the progress Armenia has made in recent years. In the

programme document	needs special attention. The COVID-19 pandemic, combined with	
	the escalation of the Nagorno Karabakh conflict has left a significant	
	impact on the welfare of Armenian people and it has especially had	
	severe consequences to the most vulnerable groups, including	
	children. We welcome that the programme priorities aim to assist	
	Armenia in overcoming the issues caused by the pandemic as well	
	as the conflict.	
	There should be an even bigger emphasis on digital transformation	
	of Armenia, which plays a significant role in the health care,	
	education and social support services provided to children. The	
	COVID-19 pandemic has shed light on the digital divide in societies	
	and the urgent need to support this digital transformation. Solutions	
	for e-health, distance learning, telemedicine and tracking viruses	

will not only help during the pandemic, but will support the resilience and development of Armenia for years to come. However, we note and welcome that in several subchapters of this document, the need for e-services has been outlined.
Overall, we support the programme priorities and welcome that the Adaptive programming approaches have helped to adjust the document according to the most urgent needs.
