Funding requirements

UNICEF is requesting US\$15.3 million to meet the urgent humanitarian needs caused by severe food insecurity and flooding caused by Cyclone Idai.⁶ Without timely and adequate funding, UNICEF will be unable to support the national response to the country's current crisis the areas of health, nutrition, WASH, child protection and education.
